Social Media Safety

Social media safety is a relevant topic for everyone who works with young people. In a short period of time, new technologies have revolutionized the way we communicate. This course introduces guidelines for protecting youth when using social media and electronic communication.

You will learn to:

- Identify the risks of using social media and other forms of electronic communication;
- Follow policies and best practices governing the use of social media and electronic communication;
- Respond appropriately to improper and illegal use of social media and electronic communication.

Recognizing Abuse and Exploitation in Elder-Serving Programs

As a minister, employee or volunteer with an elder-serving program, you provide a valuable service to those in your care.

Participants learn:

- Types of elder abuse and exploitation;
- How to recognize the risk factors and warning signs of abuse and exploitation;
- How to establish good relationships and provide appropriate care to the elderly;
- How to protect oneself from false allegations of abuse and exploitation and
- How to report suspected abuse, neglect and exploitation.



Abuse Risk Management for Employees

This module shows employees how molesters operate, the devastating effects of abuse, and the specific steps employees can take to prevent abuse and false allegations of abuse.

Supervising for a Positive Work Environment

Supervisors play an important role in complying with employment laws and encouraging a positive work place environment.

Participants learn:

- What constitutes workplace discrimination, harassment, and retaliation;
- What the law requires of supervisors to prevent, stop, and respond to discrimination, harassment and retaliation;
- What supervisors should do if they are accused of discrimination, harassment or retaliation.

Preventing Abuse against Adults/Elders with Disabilities

Providing care to those with disabilities is rewarding and challenging work. However, some caregivers psychologically abuse, physically abuse, steal from those they care for, and some even sexually abuse people in their care.

Participants learn:

- Facts about abuse of people with disabilities;
- Characteristics of potential victims;
- Steps to keep adults/elders safe;
- Awareness of potential abusers and high-risk environments and
- How to prevent false allegations.
